Established in 1966 under the BC Provincial Court Act and expanded under the Federal Youth Criminal Justice Act, the VFCYJC is dedicated to educating elected representatives regarding the juvenile justice system and related issues. We also advocate for needed changes within the system and provide grant funding to applicants working in this field.

The committee is uniquely positioned to connect regional and municipal decision-makers with frontline service providers. Our voting members are elected representatives from the Capital Region District's 13 municipalities and three school districts as well as CRD citizen appointees.

In brief, our goals are two-fold:

- To **educate** by providing a safe space within which regional decision makers and leaders can meet and learn from those doing the frontline work and take these lessons home to their own councils, service providers and local contexts.
- To **advocate** for service agencies as they work on behalf of families and children throughout the CRD.

Our sub-committees include Court Watch, Youth and Family Matters, Communications, Priorities/Grants and the Capital Region Action Team for Sexually Exploited Youth.

As a result of our broad legislated mandate, the VFCYJC over its 57-year history has engaged with many sectors of our community: children, parents, caregivers, teachers, youth-serving agencies, social workers, lawyers, judges, police, probation officers, and restorative justice and victim services professionals, among others.

Now a delegated commission of the Capital Region District, the Committee is re-energized with a revised strategic plan and a refreshed commitment in continuing the VFCYJC's long-standing mandate and tradition.
